Regular MINUTES of the COUNCIL MEETING

April 28, 2015

The Regular Meeting of the Mayor and Council was held in Council Chambers and called to order at 7:35 p.m. by Mayor Lombardo. He asked all present to participate in a moment of silence, followed by a salute to the flag.

Adequate notice of this meeting was provided to the Cranford Chronicle, advertised on January 16, 2015, notification was sent to the Star Ledger and prominently posted on the municipal public bulletin board and filed in the office of the municipal clerk informing the Public of the time and place according to the Provisions of the Open Public Meeting Law (Chapter 231, P.L. 1975).

Does anyone present wish to be heard concerning 2015 Municipal Budget?

Bruce Paterson, 325 Willow Avenue expressed his concerns with this budget that is being introduced tonight. He would like to see the tax impact at zero. He talked about accumulated sick and vacation time for employees, the amount of properties that are delinquent with their tax payments, the use of surplus and Councilman Petruzzelli's health benefits.

Councilman Mathieu asked about the administrator's settlement. It was stated it was about \$29,000. Councilman Mathieu stated he had heard it was a half million and just wanted the correct amount to be on the record.

Council President Nierstedt discussed the library and that we may lose the library down the road, with the in-kind fees etc. He asked that Mr. Paterson not dwell on Councilman Petruzzelli's health benefits that he won his last election and this is water over the dam.

Councilwoman Todisco talked about in-kind fees and explained these are expenses that the municipality incurs from the library that helps the library function. The library pays in-kind fees to the school. She mentioned the possibility of subsidizing the library down the road. She explained the library does have other sources of funding other than the state.

Councilman Martin feels we should be able to work some of the numbers. He challenged Councilman Mathieu to come up with a better plan for a budget.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND § 21-37 (SCHEDULE OF RESIDENT PREFERENTIAL PERMIT PARKING ZONES) IN ARTICLE XIV (RESIDENT PREFERENTIAL PERMIT PARKING) IN CHAPTER 21 (VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC) AND TO AMEND § 21-8. (TWO-HOUR PARKING) IN ARTICLE I (TRAFFIC AND PARKING) IN CHAPTER 21 (VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC) OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF GARWOOD TO REVISE THE RESIDENT PREFERENTIAL PERMIT PARKING ZONE AND TO REVISE THE TWO-HOUR PARKING ZONE BY ADDING ADDITIONAL STREETS TO EACH.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF GARWOOD:

SECTION 1. Article XIV (Resident Preferential Permit Parking) in Chapter 21 (Vehicles and Traffic) of the Code of the Borough of Garwood is hereby amended by amending § 21-37 (Schedule of Resident Preferential Parking Zones) as follows:

§ 21-37. Schedule of Resident Preferential Parking Zones.

In accordance with the provisions of § 21-34, the following portions of streets and roadways of the Borough of Garwood are designated as resident preferential parking zones:

SECTION 2. §21-8 (Two-hour parking) in Article I (Traffic and Parking) in Chapter 21 (Vehicles and Traffic) of the Code of the Borough of Garwood is hereby amended to read as follows:

§ 21-8. Two-hour parking.

A. (No Change)

B. No person shall park any vehicle, other than one displaying a residential parking permit issued in accordance with § 21-31, et seq., on the following streets for more than two hours duration between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, holidays excluded:

POLICE: Councilwoman Tarantino, Chr.

Police Chief Underhill received the following letter from Sheriff Cryan regarding Capt. Stoffer's assistance with Active Shooter training for his agency She read the letter:

I would like to express my sincere thanks for allowing Captain Doug Stoffer assist in providing instruction for my officers in Active Shooter Response Techniques on March 7, 2015. Our Office faces unique challenges to schedule large scale training for critical components such as Active Shooter Response. We do not have enough trainers with the requisite expertise to conduct this hands-on block of instruction effectively. Captain Stoffer and other members of the S.W.A.T. team volunteered to assist our core instructors. His professionalism, knowledge and application of the tactics went a long way to ensure a highly successful training evolution. It is resource sharing such as this that ensures our officers are

prepared for critical incidents within Union County. If I may ever be of mutual assistance, please don't hesitate to call.

The Fire Division was called out to three separate fires just over the past 24 hours the department had three mutual aid calls to the towns of Clark, Kenilworth and Scotch Plains as part of Union Counties Mutual Aid agreement. The Fire Division continues to provide their services to all in need. He thanked the department.

BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS: Councilman Mathieu, Chr.

On Wednesday evening, April 15th, at Lincoln School, we had a joint meeting of the Buildings and Grounds Committees for the Council and the BOE. As a result of this meeting, we extended through June 30th the janitorial agreement between the Boro and the BOE as it regards the Sports & Recreation Center. In short, the BOE will be sending one maintenance staff member to clean the building 1.5 hours twice per week at a rate of \$25 per hour. Total weekly costs and cleaning time are \$75 and 3 hours, respectively. In that regard, the B&G committee unanimously recommends the adoption of Resolution 15-188. Please note that the BOE has already passed such a resolution at its last regularly scheduled meeting on Tuesday, April 21st. We have scheduled another joint B&G meeting for 7pm on Thursday, June 11th at Lincoln School. At that meeting, we will be seeking feedback from all parties, including the head of Garwood's Recreation Commission, as to how this arrangement is working out. We will then see if any further modifications are necessary or if we can simply extend the agreement as it now stands. Buildings and Grounds recommends the adoption of 15-188.

LAWS AND LICENSES: Councilman Martin, Chr. *NO REPORT*

RECREATION: Councilwoman Todisco Chr.

Thank you, Mayor. The Recreation Commission last met on April 15th. The spring soccer program for children from 3 to 5 years old has begun and takes place on Friday afternoons at the turf field. The registration cost was lowered this year from \$50 to \$25 with each child getting a t-shirt and soccer ball for signing up. Clark Soccer, using Red Bull trainers, is running the program and the \$25 is complete profit for the Borough. With about 20 children signed up, this is generating about \$500 in revenue. A summer basketball clinic will be conducted one night per week in the summer and I will have more information on that when the details are finalized. The Recreation Commission hired Dana Parkhill to be the Summer Recreation Director this year, a position she held last year as well. I brought the concerns of the gentleman that came to our last Council meeting to the Commission and I have since called him to let him know about this. The Commission decided to turn on the lights at the turf field until 9pm on Saturdays to give the public additional hours. Presently, the turf field is completely open on Saturdays and Mondays to the public. It is also open after school until 6pm on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays when rentals begin. On Fridays, it is available until 4:30pm when Recreation Instructional Soccer begins. As I mentioned at the last meeting, the Commission wants to balance between public time and time for rentals, which generate revenue. So far at this point in the year, the Complex has generated \$10,000 in revenue. The monthly schedule is currently available on the Borough website under the Garwood Sports and Recreation Complex tab. April has been posted as a PDF in order to get it up as soon as possible, but in the future, the plan is to have it uploaded in a way that it will automatically update on the website as events are scheduled. Also, the Commission is presently working on acquiring an electronic board or computer screen to display the schedule at the complex itself to help keep the public informed.
