Reoccurring Activities

- Complete regular public works services including residential pickup(s) of household waste, brush/grass and white goods.

- Excavate the abandoned storm sewer and remove sections of broken pipe fronting the YMCA on East Street to alleviate a reoccurring sinkhole.
- Continue to clean up the leaves at all Borough owned properties.
- Continue to elevate and prune shade trees throughout the Borough.
- Prepare the Georgianna Memorial for the Veterans Day ceremony.

Residents are reminded that bagged leaves will be picked up curbside as follows:

- North side of the Borough; week of November 21st and December 5th.
- South side of the Borough; remainder of this week and the week of November 28th

Residents are also reminded that loose leaves are not permitted in the street but may be placed curbside in covered receptacles no larger than 32 gallons as an alternate to bagged leaves.

The Historical Committee presented yet another successful event for the Borough this past Saturday with the Purple Heart Memorial Program, which marked the 5th anniversary of the installation of the monument. About 75 people attended the program, which included speeches from Mayor Lombardo, former Mayor Quattrocchi, and Commander James Hill of the Union County Chapter 28 Military Order of the Purple Heart. Monsignor Ron Marczewski, the pastor of the Church of St. Anne in Garwood, gave the benediction. In retrieving the names of Garwood residents who earned the Purple Heart, the Committee found that inclusion in the Purple Heart database is voluntary. In the process, the Committee understood that they simply would not be able to find all of the names. Many of the names found were located through research in the Gar-Words, a newsletter printed by Garwood residents for our servicemen during World War II. The names the committee found there were listed and read at the ceremony. After the ceremony residents came up to the committee and added more names, which included Joseph Castaldo, Albert Laucius, John Lombardo, Bill Prish, Leonard Bernosky and Paul Battiloro. Thank you to all the service men and women who put their lives in danger to protect our freedoms. The Historical Committee looks forward to taking a more active role in the near future to record Garwood's history. That's all for my report.
