The Governing Body has adopted Ordinance #15-18, expanding the Resident Preferential Permit Parking Zones as follows.

Schedule of Resident Preferential Parking Zones. Two-hour parking.

In accordance with law, the following portions of streets and roadways in the Borough of Garwood are designated as resident preferential parking zones.

No person shall park any vehicle, other than one displaying a residential parking permit issued in accordance with law on the following streets for more than two hours duration between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, holidays excluded:

Installation of Resident Preferential Permit Parking Zones signs has commenced and will continue until completed. The Governing Body has arranged for commuters to lease parking spaces in the Burger King Lot on North Avenue. Leased parking is also available in the Shoprite parking lot and in Kennedy Plaza on North Avenue.

Residents in the zone are entitled to unlimited parking permits and two (2) visitor permits. To obtain permits please complete the enclosed application and submit along with a copy of your motor vehicle(s) registration and proof of residency. Both are necessary to receive parking permit(s). Proof of residency is necessary for visitor permits. Visitor permits are non-transferable and should be returned to the borough if you move out of town. There is no fee to obtain permits. You can remit the information by mail or come to the Office of the Municipal Clerk at 403 South Avenue during business hours, Monday to Friday, 9:00 am to 4:30 pm. The office has evening hours on the second and fourth Tuesday of each month, 4:30 pm to 6:30 pm.

Businesses or their employees are not authorized to receive permits for residential parking. Weekends are not included; guests, family and friends of residents can park without permits all other times except for longer than two hours, in between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, holidays excluded.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND §21-33 (ISSUANCE OF PERMITS; DURATION; VISITOR PERMIT; DISPLAY; FEES) AND § 21-37 (SCHEDULE OF RESIDENT PREFERENTIAL PERMIT PARKING ZONES) IN ARTICLE XIV (RESIDENT PREFERENTIAL PERMIT PARKING) IN CHAPTER 21 (VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC) AND TO AMEND § 21-8. (TWO-HOUR PARKING) IN ARTICLE I (TRAFFIC AND PARKING) IN CHAPTER 21 (VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC) OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF GARWOOD TO REVISE THE RESIDENT PREFERENTIAL PERMIT PARKING ZONE AND TO REVISE THE TWO-HOUR PARKING ZONE BY ADDING ADDITIONAL STREETS TO EACH.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF GARWOOD:

SECTION 1. Article XIV (Resident Preferential Permit Parking) in Chapter 21 (Vehicles and Traffic) of the Code of the Borough of Garwood is hereby amended by amending §21-33 (Issuance of permits; duration; visitor permit; display; fees) and § 21-37 (Schedule of Resident Preferential Parking Zones) as follows:

§ 21-33. Issuance of permits; duration; visitor's permit; display.

- A. Issuance of permits. The Borough Clerk shall issue permits for resident preferential parking. Applicants for such permits shall be required to present proof of residency and vehicle ownership on said streets in the areas designated as resident preferential parking zones.

E. Two (2) visitor permits shall be issued to each household in the Resident Preferred Parking Zones for its visitors. Additional visitor permits shall be issued by the Borough Clerk upon request. Visitor permits are nontransferable.

H. All visitor permits shall be displayed on the driver's side of the dashboard of the vehicle in such a manner as to be clearly visible to an officer enforcing parking regulations.
I. There shall not be any application fee or permit fee to obtain any permit.

§ 21-37. Schedule of Resident Preferential Parking Zones.

In accordance with the provisions of § 21-34, the following portions of streets and roadways of the Borough of Garwood are designated as resident preferential parking zones:

SECTION 2. §21-8 (Two-hour parking) in Article I (Traffic and Parking) in Chapter 21 (Vehicles and Traffic) of the Code of the Borough of Garwood is hereby amended to read as follows:

§ 21-8. Two-hour parking.

- B. No person shall park any vehicle, other than one displaying a residential parking permit issued in accordance with § 21-31, et seq., on the following streets for more than two hours duration between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, holidays excluded:

SECTION 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 4. If any portion of this ordinance shall be determined to be invalid, such determination shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of said ordinance.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication in accordance with law, and after the posting of appropriate signs.

SECTION 6. The Chief of Police is hereby authorized and directed to post appropriate signs.
