The New Jersey Legalized Games of Chance Control Commission (“Commission”) was created in 1954 to supervise the administration of the Bingo and Raffle Licensing Laws throughout the State of New Jersey. Currently, the Commission annually registers approximately 7,500 eligible organizations. In order to provide uniformity in the administration of these laws throughout the state, the Commission is committed to assisting groups or organizations operating under its authority. 
