COUNCIL STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS AND OTHER REPORTS:

POLICE: Councilwoman Todisco, Chr.

Thank you, Mayor. Today is National Law Enforcement Appreciation Day and I wanted to start by saying thank you to everyone in the Garwood Police Department for the service they provide to our residents day in and day out. In preparation for tonight's meeting, I met with Chief Wright today. The PD will be getting four interns from Kean University to help with records management. Each intern will spend 120 hours over this Spring Semester and this is free of charge to the Borough. With that said, the project authorized by the Council to revamp the record, storage, and armory (really the all-purpose room of headquarters) is well underway in our Police Department. Soon there will be a file system in place that is equal to 40 regular file cabinets, where only 8 were able to fit before. Due to this effort, the Police will no longer need to pay for off-site storage and will be able to fit its records and evidence much more comfortably here at headquarters. I look forward to sitting down with Chief Wright and the rest of the Committee to discuss ideas for exciting new initiatives for our Police Department and community at-large this year. PUBLIC HEALTH: Councilman McCormack *NO REPORT*

STREETS AND ROADS/ECOLOGY: Councilwoman Blumenstock, Chr.

In addition to regular garbage pickup, some of the DPW's recent activities include delivering sand to the Sports Complex for the Celebrations' luminary's sale and providing assistance to administration for zoning office clean-up. They also installed new plow edges on the larger snow removal equipment.

Speaking of snow: Public Works employees worked a total of 33.5 man hours of overtime on December 15th and 23 man hours of overtime on December 30th de-icing streets and sidewalks (before and after the event) and removing snow on all Borough owned sidewalks.

Public Works employees also worked a total of 36 man hours of regular time and 68 hours of overtime for snow removal during and after the snow storm on January 4th to January 5th. They plowed and de-iced all Borough streets, parking lots and Borough owned sidewalks during and after the storm and de-iced all Borough school crossings before and after the storm at various times. They traveled to the Union County Public Works Facility and loaded the truck with salt before/after the storm as needed.

In other news from Streets and Roads, we had a committee meeting last Thursday together with our Superintendent to discuss the state of our snow plows. We currently have a 1992 truck with plow, a 1996 truck with plow and salt spreader and a 2014 truck with plow and salt spreader. All are used in a snow event. However, as I mentioned at the Dec. 26th Council meeting, the 1996 was out of commission. The drive shaft mount did rot off and unfortunately, when it did so, it caused the two piece driveshaft assembly to break in half and bounced around doing some damage to the brake chamber, hydraulic lines and the exhaust system among other damage. The cost to repair the damage would be approximately \$4800. The committee unanimously came to the agreement that with the value of truck being so little and with further extensively rotting hardware on the truck, that we should not do the repairs but take this truck completely out of commission. The discussion then became about taking the salt spreader from that '96 truck and putting it on the '92 to use as a current backup for the 2014 truck. Though the '92 is even older, it has not been exposed to the salt and its condition is such that it is at this point feasible to use it as a backup for this current season. The cost of retrofitting the salt spreader would be approximately \$6,000. Councilman McCormack was very much in favor of this and though Councilman Lazarow and I were hesitant to go ahead with this, we are willing to compromise with Councilman McCormack because we value finding consensus as a committee whenever possible.

Lastly, the committee discussed the necessity of purchasing another snow plow vehicle now that the '96 is no longer viable. This is actually something that has been on the capital plan for years. All three of us agreed to support the purchase of a slightly smaller mason truck to make it more versatile and one that could be used throughout the year, not just in snow events, and would also be less expensive than the size trucks we currently have. We are currently gathering estimates for this vehicle and will bring this to council for discussion once we have all the information.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF GARWOOD REGARDING ANY SHORTFALLS ASSOCIATED WITH THE PROVISION OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING AS SET FORTH IN THE BOROUGH'S ADOPTED HOUSING ELEMENT AND FAIR SHARE PLAN

WHEREAS, the Borough of Garwood, County of Union, has petitioned the Superior Court of New Jersey for a Judgment of Compliance and Repose with respect to its adopted Housing Element and Fair Share Plan; and

WHEREAS, the plan submitted to the Court allocates funds for affordability assistance, administration and eligible housing activities; and

WHEREAS, Garwood anticipates that funding and assistance will come from developer fees collected and projected and from the Union County Rehabilitation Program; and

WHEREAS, it is the Court's position that Garwood must allocate funds for the provision of affordable housing as set forth in the Borough's adopted Housing Element and Fair Share Plan; and

WHEREAS, in the event that the above funding sources prove inadequate to complete the affordable housing programs included in Garwood's Housing Element and Fair Share Plan, Garwood shall take all appropriate actions to secure and make available sufficient funding from all sources to address any shortfalls.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the Borough of Garwood, Union County, that the Governing Body does hereby agree to take appropriate actions, consistent with law, to fund any shortfall in its approved affordable housing programs that may arise whether due to inadequate funding from other sources or for any other related reason; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any shortfall may also be funded by bonding if there are no other resources, provided, however, that the Borough should first utilize all other funding sources available to it, including but not limited to, development fees.


