ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF GARWOOD, COUNTY OF UNION, NEW JERSEY ADOPTING THE 'GARWOOD PAPERBOARD REDEVELOPMENT PLAN – BLOCK 211, LOT 6 – 75 NORTH AVENUE,' PURSUANT TO THE LOCAL REDEVELOPMENT AND HOUSING LAW, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 *et seq.*

WHEREAS, the Borough of Garwood, in the County of Union, New Jersey (the "**Borough**"), a public body corporate and politic of the State of New Jersey, is authorized pursuant to the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, *N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 et seq.* (the "**Redevelopment Law**"), to determine whether certain parcels of land within the Borough constitute an area in need of rehabilitation and/or an area in need of redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, on September 24, 2013, the Borough Council (the "**Borough Council**") adopted Resolution No. 13-134 authorizing the Planning Board of the Borough (the "**Planning Board**") to investigate whether the area commonly known on the Borough tax maps as Block 211, Lot 6 (the "**Property**") met certain criteria under the Redevelopment Law as an "area in need of redevelopment"; and

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2014, the Planning Board recommended to the Borough Council that the Property met certain criteria under the Redevelopment Law as an "area in need of redevelopment"; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution 15-273, the Borough Council designated the Property as an "area in need of redevelopment" in accordance with the Redevelopment Law (the "**Redevelopment Area**") and directed the Planning Board to prepare a redevelopment plan for the Redevelopment Area; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board held a public hearing on August 8, 2018, to review and comment on the proposed redevelopment plan entitled "Garwood Paperboard Redevelopment Plan – Block 211, Lot 6 – 75 North Avenue," (the "**Redevelopment Plan**"), and resolved to transmit the Redevelopment Plan to the Borough Council with a recommendation that the Redevelopment Plan be adopted; and

WHEREAS, upon review of the Planning Board's recommendation of the Redevelopment Plan, the Borough Council has determined to adopt the Redevelopment Plan (in the form attached hereto as *Exhibit A*), to ensure the success of redevelopment within the Redevelopment Area, in conformity with the Borough's redevelopment objectives.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Garwood, County of Union, New Jersey that:

Section 1. The aforementioned recitals are incorporated herein as though fully set forth at length.

Section 2. The Redevelopment Plan, attached hereto as *Exhibit A*, is hereby adopted pursuant to the terms of *N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-7*.

Section 3. A copy of this Ordinance and the Redevelopment Plan shall be available for public inspection at the office of the Borough Clerk during regular business hours.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect in accordance with all applicable laws.

1. The first ever class of the Garwood Police Department Youth Academy was a huge success. Cadets had the opportunity to experience first-hand what it's like to be a police officer. Gurrieri Memorial Park, which is at the corner of Fourth and Walnut, was first installed in 2003 and dedicated in September of that year. We are looking forward to rededicating it this year, on its 15th anniversary. The Historical Committee has invited Mayor Gurrieri's family to the event, will have a couple guest speakers, and will be serving coffee and donuts after the short ceremony. For those that may not be aware, Georgiana Gurrieri served her fellow citizens on the Garwood Council from 1975 to 1988. Then, she was elected Garwood's first female mayor and served from 1989 until her passing in 1990.
