ORDINANCE NO. 18-26

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND § 67-17 (NOTICE AND REGISTRATION REQUIRED) IN ARTICLE VII (MAINTENANCE, REGISTRATION AND REPAIR OF RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES SUBJECT TO FORECLOSURE) IN CHAPTER 67 (BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES) OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF GARWOOD TO REVISE A REFERENCE TO THE REGISTRATION OR RENEWAL FEE

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Garwood

Section 1. § 67-17 (Notice and Registration Required) in Article VII (Maintenance, Registration and Repair of Residential Property Subject to Foreclosure) in Chapter 67 (Building and Structures) of the Code of the Borough of Garwood is hereby amended to read as follows:

- B. The registration shall remain valid for one (1) year from the date of registration, except for the initial registration, which shall be prorated on a monthly basis through December 31. The creditor shall be required to renew the registration annually as long as the building remains a vacant and abandoned property and shall pay a registration or renewal fee in the amount prescribed in § 67-26.1 for each vacant property registered.

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section 3. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance shall be declared invalid for any reason whatsoever, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance, which shall continue in full force and effect, and to this end, the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.

Section 4. This ordinance shall become effective upon final passage and publication in accordance with law.

Garwood PD has implemented several speed control initiatives. Thermoplast paint will be utilized to paint stripes in the street, giving a raised effect. This is a DOT approved and effected method of "passive speed control" Lines will be painted on Center Street, by narrowing the roadway with white shoulder lines it will give the illusion of a narrower effect. We will also be painting(yellow?) "rumble strips" on Spruce & West,

Pine & East, 2nd & Cedar, & 2nd & Oak. St. Weather permitting we will get it done this year, if not it will be early next year, the Thermoplast paint is temperature sensitive and installed in layers, therefore if it is too cold, we are left with no choice but for the weather warm up. 2 new radar speed sign have arrived. One will be place on Myrtle and Spruce, they are meant to be moved around, and will be as needed. They are expected to be installed within the next week. They have been successful in curbing the speeding on 4th Ave, and are a welcomed addition, ty Chief Wright. Permit parking signs are in for restricted parking by athletic field, will be installing these signs within the next week or so. Once the parking signs are up, we will issue permits, & enforce the ordinance.

RESOLUTION NO. 18-206

RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF GARWOOD, IN THE COUNTY OF UNION, NEW JERSEY, COVENANTING TO COMPLY WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1986, AS AMENDED, APPLICABLE TO THE EXCLUSION FROM GROSS INCOME FOR FEDERAL INCOME TAX PURPOSES OF INTEREST ON OBLIGATIONS ISSUED BY THE BOROUGH OF GARWOOD AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, MUNICIPAL CLERK, CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER AND OTHER BOROUGH OFFICIALS TO TAKE SUCH ACTION AS THEY MAY DEEM NECESSARY OR ADVISABLE TO EFFECT SUCH COMPLIANCE AND DESIGNATING A \$1,600,735 BOND ANTICIPATION NOTE AND A \$140,000 SPECIAL EMERGENCY NOTE, BOTH ISSUES DATED NOVEMBER 8, 2018 AND PAYABLE NOVEMBER 8, 2019, AS "QUALIFIED TAX-EXEMPT OBLIGATIONS" PURSUANT TO SECTION 265(b)(3) OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1986, AS AMENDED.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Garwood, in the County of Union, New Jersey (the "Borough") from time to time issues bonds, notes and other obligations, the interest on which is excluded from gross income for Federal income tax purposes, and desires to take such action as may be necessary or advisable to establish and maintain such exclusion; and

WHEREAS, the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), contains provisions with respect to the exclusion from gross income for Federal income tax purposes of interest on obligations, including provisions, among others, which require issuers of tax-exempt obligations, such as the Borough to account for and rebate certain arbitrage earnings to the United States Treasury and to take other action to establish and maintain such Federal tax exclusion; and

WHEREAS, the Borough intends to issue a \$1,600,735 Bond Anticipation Note and a \$140,000 Special Emergency Note, both issues dated November 8, 2018 and payable November 8, 2019 (collectively, the "Notes"); and

WHEREAS, the Borough desires to designate the Notes as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" pursuant to Section 265(b)(3) of the Code;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Garwood, in the County of Union, New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. The Borough Council hereby covenants on behalf of the Borough, to the extent permitted by the Constitution and the laws of the State of New Jersey, to do and perform all acts and things permitted by law and necessary to assure that interest paid on bonds, notes or other obligations of the Borough (including the Notes) be and remain excluded from gross income of the owners thereof for Federal income tax purposes pursuant to Section 103 of the Code.

SECTION 2. The Mayor, Municipal Clerk, Chief Financial Officer and the other officials of the Borough are hereby authorized and directed to take such action, make such representations and give such assurances as they may deem necessary or advisable to effect compliance with the Code.

SECTION 3. The Notes are hereby designated as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" for the purpose of Section 265(b)(3) of the Code.

SECTION 4. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) said Notes are not "private activity bonds" as defined in the Code and (2) the Borough and its subordinate entities, if any, do not reasonably anticipate issuing in excess of \$10 million of new money tax-exempt obligations (other than private activity bonds) during the calendar year 2018.

SECTION 5. It is further determined and stated that the Borough has not, as of the date hereof, issued any tax-exempt obligations (other than the Notes) during the calendar year 2018.

SECTION 6. The Borough will, to the best of its ability, attempt to comply with respect to the limitations on issuance of tax-exempt obligations pursuant to Section 265(b)(3) of the Code; however, said Borough does not covenant to do so, and hereby expressly states that a covenant is not made hereby.

SECTION 7. The issuing officers of the Borough are hereby authorized to deliver a certified copy of this resolution to the original purchaser of the Notes and to further provide such original purchaser with a certificate of obligations issued during the calendar year 2018 dated as of the date of delivery of the Notes.

SECTION 8. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
