RESOLUTION NO. 25-63

**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF GARWOOD, UNION COUNTY,
STATE OF NEW JERSEY SUPPORTING REVOLUTION NJ**

WHEREAS, Governor Philip Murphy and the New Jersey State Legislature created Revolution NJ in 2018 to plan, encourage, develop, and coordinate the commemoration of the 250th anniversary of the founding of the United States, New Jersey's pivotal role in the American Revolution, and the contributions of its diverse peoples to the nation's past, present, and future; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Historical Commission, under the leadership of Secretary of State Tahesha Way, with its non-profit partner Crossroads of the American Revolution established Revolution NJ to advance the role that history plays in public discourse, community engagement, education, tourism, and scholarship in New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, Revolution NJ will engage New Jerseyans in all 21 counties and 564 municipalities through its officially recognized programs, initiatives, and events over the next ten years; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting and desirable that we commemorate the beginning of the Nation and the role New Jersey played over the past 250 years as well as its present and future role as part of the United States,

with particular focus on the individuals, ideas, and events that shaped our Country, State, and Borough of Garwood]; and

WHEREAS, Revolution NJ will consider the role New Jersey played during the American Revolution when it saw more battles and skirmishes than any other state and was truly the Crossroads of the American Revolution; and

WHEREAS, Revolution NJ will highlight the role New Jerseyans played beyond the battlefield during the American Revolution when people of diverse backgrounds contributed to the development of the State and the Nation in various ways and fought for the right to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness; and

WHEREAS, preserving, studying, and enjoying state history strengthens communities and builds bonds between New Jersey residents as we work together toward the goals of justice and equality embedded in the United States Constitution;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Borough of Garwood] hereby endorses Revolution NJ and its mission to advance the role that history plays in public discourse, community engagement, education, tourism and scholarship in New Jersey.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that:

1. The Borough Council commemorates the 250th anniversary of the establishment of the United States as an independent Nation.
2. The Borough Council authorizes the appointment of a committee to develop a plan for this commemoration that will promote the maximum involvement of our residents, neighborhoods, businesses, schools, civic organizations, and institutions in the commemorations.
3. The Borough Council further urges all its residents to reflect upon the significance of this event and the role that our State and its diverse people have played in the history and development of our Nation and to participate in this important commemoration, endeavoring to include the stories of all those whose lives are part of the history of what we now know as New Jersey, and understanding that the revolution continues today as we uphold the revolutionary ideals articulated in our founding documents.

RESOLUTION NO. 25-64

**RESOLUTION AMENDING THE LENGTH OF SERVICE AWARD PROGRAM (LOSAP)
IN THE BOROUGH OF GARWOOD**

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Borough of Garwood, County of Union, State of New Jersey on July 11, 2000 adopted Ordinance No. 00-10, a Length of Service Award Program (LOSAP Program) to enhance the ability of the Garwood Fire Department and Garwood First Aid Squad to retain and recruit volunteers for their respective agencies and;

WHEREAS, in the General Election of the State of New Jersey on November 7, 2000, the legal voters of the Borough of Garwood overwhelmingly approved the establishment of a LOSAP Program with a vote count of 1083 YES and 242 NO; and;

WHEREAS, the Governing Body adopted Resolution No. 14-190 on April 2, 2014 increasing the LOSAP contribution amount from \$1,150 to \$1,589, the maximum amount allowed; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body adopted Resolution No. 15-172 on March 24, 2015 increasing the LOSAP contribution amount from \$1,589 to \$1,614, the maximum amount allowed; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body adopted Resolution No. 17-084 on March 28, 2017 increasing the LOSAP contribution amount from \$1,614 to \$1,635, the maximum amount allowed; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body adopted Resolution No. 18-094 on March 27, 2018 increasing the LOSAP contribution amount from \$1,635 to \$1,648, the maximum amount allowed; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body adopted Resolution No. 19-170 on February 28, 2019 increasing the LOSAP contribution amount from \$1,648 to \$1,674, the maximum amount allowed; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body adopted Resolution No. 20-264 on February 13, 2020 increasing the LOSAP contribution amount from \$1,674 to \$1,705, the maximum amount allowed; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the Governing Body desires to amend the LOSAP Eligibility Document in order to further enhance eligibility and the effectiveness of the LOSAP Program; and,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the Borough of Garwood, County of Union, State of New Jersey that:

1. The maximum LOSAP contribution amount shall be increased by 2.5% from \$1,705 to \$1,748 in accordance with the annual CPI adjustments for CY 2025 as authorized by the Department of Community Affairs Division of Local Government Services in accordance with the requirements of N.J.A.C. 5:30-14.9, N.J.S.A. 40A:14-185(f) and LFN 2025-01.
2. Amendments to the LOSAP Eligibility Document are hereby made in accordance with the requirements of N.J.A.C. 5:30-14 and shall be submitted to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services of the New Jersey State Department of Community Affairs along with a certified copy of this resolution.
3. These amendments shall be effective retroactively to the start of the LOSAP benefit year, 01/01/24 to 12/31/24.

RESOLUTION NO. 25-65

A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING APRIL 25, 2025 AS ARBOR DAY IN THE BOROUGH OF GARWOOD

WHEREAS, in 1872, J. Sterling Morton proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set aside for the planting of trees; and

WHEREAS, the holiday, called Arbor Day, was first observed with the planting of more than a million trees in Nebraska; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Garwood has recently appointed a new Shade Tree Office, is in the process of creating its first Shade Tree Advisory Board, and is now in the process of restoring its tree lined streets and creating a community forestry program; and

WHEREAS, each year the Borough of Garwood plants trees as a way of teaching its citizens, young and young at heart, of the benefit of trees to our environment; and

WHEREAS, I am proud to dedicate Arbor Day to our Residents, Employees, Business Owners, Stakeholders and Shade Tree Advisory Board for their commitment and dedication to the Borough of Garwood.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jennifer Blumenstock, Mayor of the Borough of Garwood, do hereby proclaim Friday, April 25, 2025, as "Arbor Day 2025" in the Borough of Garwood.

RESOLUTION NO. 25-66

APPOINTMENT OF ACTING MUNICIPAL CLERK

WHEREAS, when a vacancy occurs in the office of the Municipal Clerk, NJAC 5:32-5.3 permits the governing body to appoint an Acting Municipal Clerk from the date of the vacancy to serve as acting municipal clerk for a period not to exceed one year and for an additional two years with the approval of the Director of New Jersey Local Government Services; and

WHEREAS, such a situation has occurred in the Borough of Garwood as of April 1, 2025 with the leaving of the prior Municipal Clerk; and

WHEREAS, Patricia Vazquez shall receive additional compensation, in the amount equaling a total annual salary of \$60,000 for the duration of the time period that Ms. Vazquez serves as Acting Municipal Clerk; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Garwood Borough Council that Patricia Vazquez be appointed the full-time Acting Municipal Clerk for the Borough of Garwood effective April 1, 2025.
